

18,000 Large Mouth Bass Find a New Home in Lake Seminole

On May 28, 2008, the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission released approximately 18,000 juvenile large mouth bass into restored habitats around Lake Seminole. Lake restoration projects that took place in 2004, 2006, and 2007 were critical to creating the necessary habitat to support a bass fishery. In the 1960's Lake Seminole was considered a premier bass fishing lake, but sediment buildup in bass nesting areas and poor water quality caused the bass population to falloff dramatically. Now with newly created habitat and multiple water quality improvement projects on the horizon we have hope that Lake Seminole will return to its bass fishing glory.
