Stroll through the unique blend of Florida native plants and exotic ornamentals from around the world that are a vibrant showcase of rich botanical bounty. Formal gardens, scenic vistas and natural Florida landscapes unfold across 120 acres at the Florida Botanical Gardens. Every garden and path is a place for an up-close-and-personal interaction with nature. A variety of Florida's wildlife is also here to enjoy, from turtles, fish and butterflies to egrets, osprey and an occasional bald eagle.



Pause FOR A NATURAL REFRESHER

Looking for a place to relax, reflect or become inspired? The Gardens offer many opportunities to escape the hustle and bustle of life. The inherent natural beauty inspires and encourages the inner artist, photographer and poet in each of us. Relax in an Adirondack chair near the water's edge for an uninterrupted view of McKay Creek and its marvelous wildlife. Stay for a moment to see the occasional alligator slide by or a little blue heron hunting for a meal at the water's edge. Flowing fountains and brooks add just the right amount of atmosphere to provide nature's own relaxation therapy. End your visit with a refreshing walk along the foot paths that gently wind through the gardens and natural habitats.

Sustainability A NATURAL FIT FOR OUR GARDENS

Learning how to sustain a vibrant community and protect our environment are all part of a process known as sustainability. Fun and education come together for individuals or the whole family at the Florida Botanical Gardens. Your time will be well spent enjoying all the Gardens has to offer while learning about plants, flowers, natural habitats and wildlife.

Throughout the Gardens, labels reveal a wealth of information about the plants you'll see. This is helpful to both novice and expert gardeners in their quest for information.

At the Gardens, every plant and tree is considered a treasure with a story all its own. As you explore, you'll find teddy bear, foxtail and bottle palms in the Palm Gardens. Experience 'Golden Goddess' and giant Buddha's belly bamboo on the Tropical Walk. Enjoy 'Bossa Nova,' 'Yin' and 'Yang' in the Bromeliad Garden. 'Natchez' crape myrtles, bountiful roses and crepe-jasmine in the Wedding Garden will take your breath away.

From lemon-yellow allamandas to apple-red zinnias, there is always something beautiful blooming at the Florida Botanical Gardens. Visit www.flbg.org for a list of blooms by season.

Special activities are in bloom all year. Guided tours, plant sales, classes, festivals, workshops and topical displays are among the exciting ways the Gardens can help you tap into the wealth of nature. Experts are also on hand to answer your questions or offer tidbits of gardening knowledge during your visit.
