


Locations

The mobile medical team has a regular schedule that is followed during the week. The locations and times have been established in an attempt to provide services to the largest number of people each day.

Outreach efforts to inform the homeless and other agencies of the team's schedule are done on an ongoing basis. Any homeless person is eligible for the team's services, whether they need medical care, dental care referrals, or referrals to other assistance programs.




Mobile Medical Unit





Human Services operates a Mobile Medical Unit in its efforts to improve the quality of life for citizens in Pinellas County. The Mobile Medical Unit provides outreach medical care and dental care referrals to the homeless population in Pinellas County.

Since 1988, outreach medical care and dental care referrals have been provided to the homeless population of Pinellas County via the Mobile Medical Unit. Approximately 50% of the operating funds for this vehicle are provided by federal grant money through the Bureau of Primary Health Care.



Primary Health Care is provided at no charge to homeless patients with incomes at or below 100% of the Federal Poverty Level. A sliding fee

scale for services is applied for incomes between 101% - 200% of the Federal Poverty Level.

The Mobile Medical Unit visits shelters, soup kitchens, drop-in centers and other locations where the homeless congregate.

Patients are seen in the vehicle, which is equipped as a rolling physician's office. The vehicle carries an examination room, interview area, medical equipment, cellular phone and laptop computers. The Mobile Medical Unit's staff includes a physician, nurses, program supervisor, case manager and driver.

Services Include:

- Primary medical care, including lab work and necessary tests
- Wellness and prevention services, including annual physicals
- Prescriptions
- Cancer screening
- Nutrition education and counseling
- Behavioral health screening and referral for treatment
- Case management services
- Referral for relief of dental pain
- Specialty care
