## Project Overview

Pinellas County Parks and Conservation Resources, through the county's Capital Improvement Program, is installing new playground equipment at Boca Ciega Millennium Park in Seminole and John Chesnut Sr. Park in Palm Harbor.

The playground equipment that was previously installed at each location is being replaced with new, inclusive playground equipment that is compliant with Americans with Disabilities Act requirements and supports Pinellas County's Age-Friendly Initiative.

The new equipment creates an environment for children of all abilities to come together socially by encouraging cognitive, interactive and participative play. Features will be built in to the equipment to shade the play area and a shock-absorbing, rubberized play surface will be installed to help prevent harsh landings when children jump from the equipment while playing.

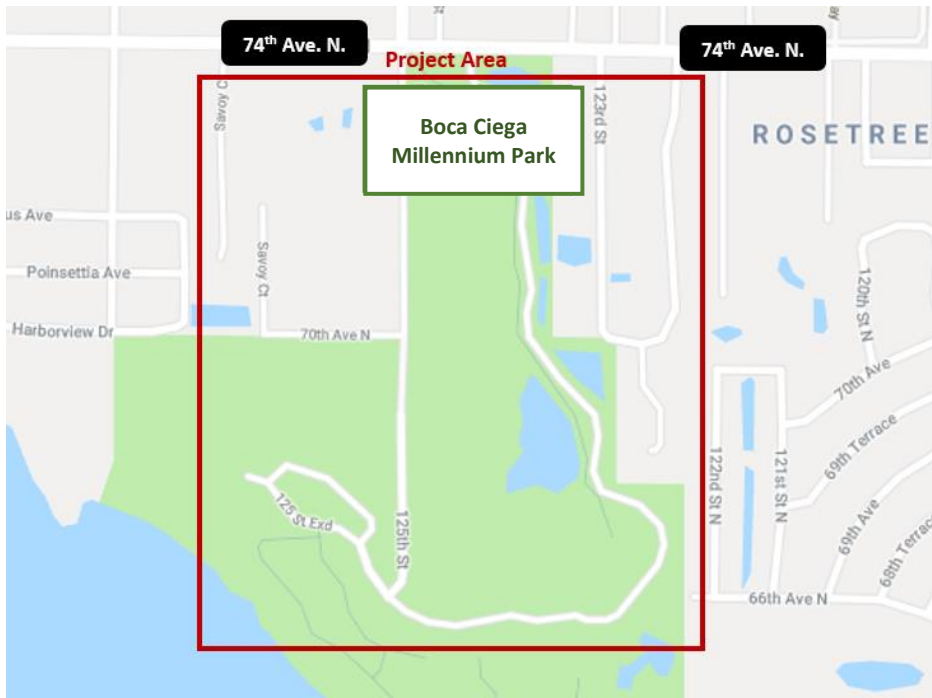
- Construction Start: September 2018
