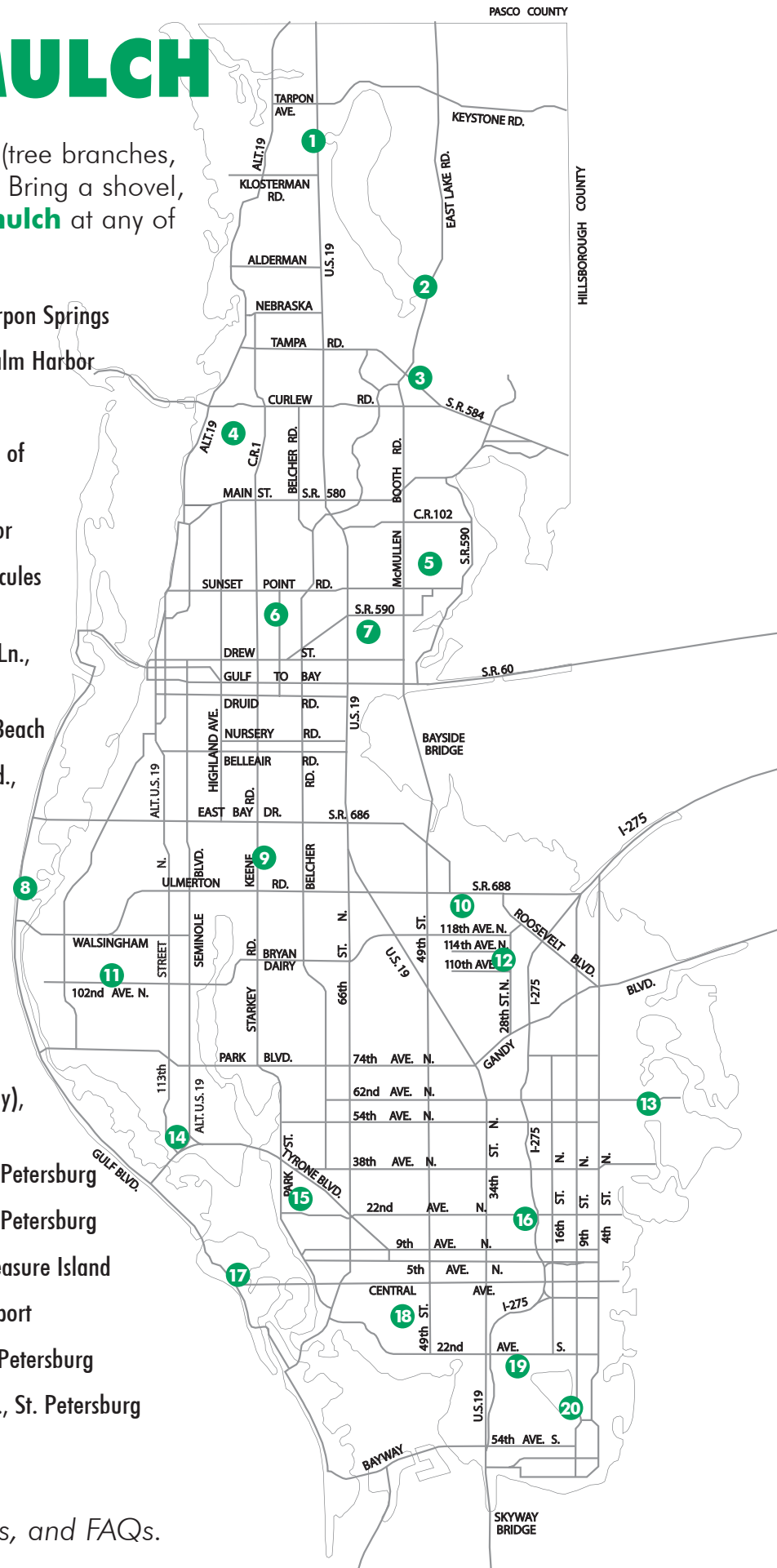


RECYCLED MULCH

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is recycled mulch?

Yard trimmings such as tree branches and leaves are processed into mulch and offered to citizens at convenient locations around the county. **Over 100,000 tons of yard waste are recycled into mulch** each year in Pinellas County. Yard waste recycling keeps usable material out of the landfill, provides attractive landscaping for citizens, and conserves water by reducing runoff.

Is recycled mulch clean?

Yes! Yard waste is ground up and sterilized using a natural heating and decomposition process prescribed by the University of Florida. **This process kills weed seeds, plant pathogens, and harmful insects.** The mulch is monitored for at least 45 days and screened to ensure a high quality, sterilized product.
