CURBSIDE RECYCLING:

- aluminum cans
- corrugated cardboard*
- mixed paper
- newspapers
- plastic bottles

* Put flattened cardboard under your bin.

RECYCLING GUIDELINES

NO PLASTIC BAGS PLEASE!

Aluminum Cans – Any empty aluminum can such as soda or juice cans. Rinse and crush if possible.

Cardboard – Clean, empty, dry corrugated (3-layer) cardboard boxes or packaging. Please flatten boxes. No pizza boxes.

Cooking Oil – Used oil or grease (such as from a turkey fryer).

Glass Bottles & Jars – Any empty glass jar or bottle (all colors). Labels okay. No caps or lids.

Mixed Paper – Any clean, dry paper item that tears, such as white or colored paper, shredded paper, office paper, magazines, phone books, catalogs, junk mail & envelopes, wrapping paper, and paperboard items such as cereal boxes or paper towel rolls. No soiled or wax coated paper such as milk cartons.

Newspapers – Dry newspapers and inserts. No string or twine. It's okay to put inside a paper bag.

Plastic Bottles – Any empty plastic bottle with a "neck" (opening smaller than the base) such as water, soda, shampoo, or ketchup. Just "check for a neck". Bottles only; no tubs, cups, or bags. Labels okay. No caps or lids. Rinse and crush if possible.

Steel (Tin) Cans – Any empty steel cans such as soup cans. Labels and lids okay. Rinse if possible.
