Safety Harbor Recycling

CURBSIDE RECYCLING:

- aluminum cans
- plastic bottles
- mixed paper
- steel cans
- newspapers

To request a curbside bin, call the city at 724-1550.

YARD WASTE RECYCLING:

Place loose items in unlined cans, not to exceed 32 gallons. Cut limbs not exceeding 6 in. diameter into 4 ft. lengths, bundle with twine, and stack at the curb. Limit 5 cans or bundles. No bags.

RECYCLING GUIDELINES

NO PLASTIC BAGS PLEASE!

Aluminum Cans – Any empty aluminum can such as soda or juice cans. Rinse and crush if possible.

Antifreeze or Motor Oil – Pour used antifreeze (or motor oil) into an empty plastic container such as an empty milk jug or detergent bottle. Please do not mix with any other liquids, including water.

Cardboard – Clean, empty, dry corrugated (3-layer) cardboard boxes or packaging. Please flatten boxes. No pizza boxes.

Cell Phones - Any size, make, or model of cell phone (digital or analog) with or without battery or charger.

Glass Bottles & Jars – Any empty glass jar or bottle (all colors). Labels okay. No caps or lids.

Mixed Paper – Any clean, dry paper item that tears, such as white or colored paper, shredded paper, office paper, magazines, phone books, catalogs, junk mail & envelopes, wrapping paper, and paperboard items such as cereal boxes or paper towel rolls. No soiled or wax coated paper such as milk cartons.

Newspapers – Dry newspapers and inserts. No string or twine. It's okay to put inside a paper bag.

Plastic Bottles – Any empty plastic bottle with a “neck” (opening smaller than the base) such as water, soda, shampoo, or ketchup. No need to check for #1 or #2—just “check for a neck”. Bottles only; no tubs, cups, or bags. Labels okay. No caps or lids. Rinse and crush if possible.

Steel (Tin) Cans – Any empty steel cans such as soup cans. Labels and lids okay. Rinse if possible.

Toner Cartridges – Inkjet or laser toner cartridges from printers, fax machines, or copiers.
